## Who is a Utility Member?

### **Small Water System**

A water system that supplies 5,000 or fewer customer service connections.

### **Water Supplier**

A water supply organization that continuously supplies water to the public, with greater than 5,000 customer service connections.

### **Water Wholesaler**

A water supply organization that provides water to other utilities or organizations at wholesale. Water wholesalers may deduct the water supplied to other AWWA utility members when determining dues.

### **Municipal Service Subscriber**

A municipal water department, board, or commission that seeks the benefits of a utility membership but is prevented from acquiring “memberships.” Dues are calculated in the same manner as a water supplier or wholesaler.

### **Contract Operations Firm**

An organization contracted to operate and/or maintain a water supply system or water wholesaler. Dues are calculated in the same manner as a water supplier or wholesaler.
